Who is eligible?

Students from St. Philip's entering K5 through 8th grade.

*Students must be enrolled for the 2017-2018 academic year and commit to attend 15 or more days. **Students who miss more than 4 days of summer school will not be allowed to continue in the program.***

What will we be doing?

Our four week summer school program at St. Philip's will include:

- Uplifting assembly with Christian-based character building lessons, songs, and prayer each day
- Hands-on learning focused on literacy and mathematics with CfUT instructors
- Enrichment opportunities including art, social studies, science, and physical education

How much does it cost?

There is no cost to attend this summer school program. However, students are required to be in uniform. The uniform t-shirt must be purchased through CfUT for \$5 each using the provided envelope. Additional t-shirts may be purchased.

What do I wear?

Students are required to wear a uniform which consists of the summer school t-shirt and regular uniform bottoms (pants, shorts, etc.), shoes, and socks. The summer school uniform t-shirt must be purchased through CfUT for \$5.

This is a non-refundable cost that must be submitted when the application is turned in using the provided envelope.

Is transportation provided?

Transportation will not be provided for this program.
