

#### **CROSS COUNTRY SEASON AT ST. PHILIP'S**

There were 22 students from 1st-8th grade on the St. Philip's cross country team this season. We had 5 races: the Pilgrim Invitational in Menomonee Falls, The Red Knight Invite at Milwaukee Lutheran HS, the Colt Invite at Crown of Life in Hubertus, the Spartan Invite at Martin Luther HS, and the Viking Invitational hosted by Wisconsin Lutheran HS. Throughout the season, we collected 17 top 10 finishers. The boys' varsity team placed 7th overall at the Viking Invitational out of 16 teams. Runners Calahan Moldenhauer, who finished 32nd, and Thomas Moldenhauer, champion at the Viking Invitational, qualified to run at the Lutheran State Meet on October 9th. Thomas finished 7th at the state meet and qualified to run at the national cross country meet on October 23. WAY TO GO SP CROSS COUNTRY ATHLETES!!


K4 – 8<sup>th</sup> Children's Christmas service 6:00PM
